Unlike our church's Haitian Grand Grove mission, this organization is located in the heart of Port au Prince where the January earthquake hit the hardest. Although the hospital was not too severely damaged, a lot of equipment was destroyed and that all has to be replaced in order for the hospital to continue functioning. To help this great need we at North Campus are hosting a yard

sale. We are asking for donations to make this a success. So please do your spring cleaning early and bring in any unwanted items that we may place in the sale. Donations will be accepted on Wednesday May 5 from 9am-6:30pm. All proceeds from the sale will go to Angel Missions.
